

Motivations Tool

The tool aimed to discover what each participant needed from the forums and also what the worst case scenario. Another participant responded to their thoughts by suggesting a way to achieve and avoid the scenarios. The aim of the tool was to make everyone aware of the motivations within the group and think of ways to respond to these effectively.





Challenges to Address

Each participant was given an ipad to use to input their responses to the question; 'What Challenges Do We Need to Address in the Forums?' These responses appeared on a touch-screen, where the responses were discussed, filtered and grouped under category headings with assistance from the facilitator, Dr Leon Cruickshank. These categories would then feed into interest modules that would be covered in the series of forums.








Designing a 40 Min Module

In small groups, the participants developed the categories into a 40 minute activity module that could fit into the group's future meetings. These modules were; Shared Identity, External Engagement, Internal Engagement, Strategy Management, Working Together and Upwards Management.


































Forum Series Plan
